

Chattanooga, Tennessee COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES August 20, 2013 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Yusuf Hakeem called the meeting to order with Vice Chairman Henderson and Councilpersons Carol Berz, Chris Anderson, Moses Freeman, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Jerry Mitchell and Ken Smith all present. AN ORDINANCE. HEREINAFTER ALSO KNOWN AS "THE FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014 BUDGET ORDINANCE". TO PROVIDE REVENUE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2013, AND ENDING JUNE 30. 2014; APPROPRIATING SAME TO THE PAYMENT OF EXPENSES OF THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT: FIXING THE RATE OF TAXATION ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN THE CITY, AND THE TIME TAXES AND PRIVILEGES ARE DUE, HOW THEY SHALL BE PAID, WHEN THEY SHALL BECOME DELINQUENT; PROVIDING FOR INTEREST AND PENALTY ON TO AMEND PRIVILEGES: AND DELINOUENT TAXES AND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 2, SECTION 2-267. After the ordinance was read, Mayor Berke made a brief speech on budgeting for outcomes and why a vote for this budget is important. Councilwoman Berz moved for approval of the ordinance. It was seconded by Councilman Freeman. A discussion ensued.

Councilman Mitchell moved to amend and substitute the budget to reflect an increase in total paving from all sources up to \$2,571,633.00. Councilman Anderson seconded the motion. Vice Chairman Henderson and Councilman Grohn also seconded. After further discussion, Councilwoman Berz called the Question.

A discussion ensued about the alternate version of the ordinance package. Greg Haynes from Planning gave a brief recap of the ordinance since it had been deferred from the

previous week's agenda. He explained that the alternate version, which was read, included a height recommendation of 36- to 42-feet, subject to the C-7 design review committee.

Chairman Hakeem opened the floor to Pryor Bacon, who spoke on behalf of the Applicant. Although no opposition was present, Councilman Mitchell voiced the community's concerns about the height of the structure impeding the view of nearby residents. Mr. Haynes briefed the Council on the C-7 guidelines for maximum building height.

After further discussion, Councilman Freeman called the Question. Chairman Hakeem ended the discussion. The motion carried to approve the alternate version of the ordinance.

RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Attorney Hinton read the guidelines for persons wishing to address the Council on non-agenda items. After which, Chairman Hakeem recognized the following persons:

• Karl Epperson (Boynton Terrace) - He voiced concerns about the Mayor's proposed Affordable Housing Pilot Program. He implored the Mayor to consider making the program affordable enough for individuals who earn minimum wages and may not make the minimum \$30,000 required for the program.

- Cynthia Stanley-Cash (North Brainerd Neighborhood Association/Districts 5 & 9) She brought a list of streets that need paving in her neighborhood. She wonders why her neighborhood doesn't qualify for a new school. She feels her neighborhood is being neglected because it is categorized as "low income" and "high poverty." She asked the Mayor to tour her neighborhood.
 - Chairman Hakeem suggested that she discuss her list of streets to Lee Norris, Public Works Administrator, who was present. Chairman Hakeem also noted that the Mayor is scheduled to tour the West side of the tunnel in Ms. Stanley-Cash's district.
 - o Councilman Gilbert indicated that he would follow-up with Ms. Stanley-Cash after the meeting.
- Gwendolyn Blackmon (Event Hall owner on Wilcox Blvd.) She wanted to make the
 Council aware of a successful event that took place at her event hall, where 648
 young adults from all walks of life attended a party and had a wonderful, safe time.
 She said there were no incidents because she had procedures in place for crowd
 control and adhered to the regulations regarding occupancy.
