# Proclamation

Thereas: Mr. Edward Freeman, a long-time resident of Mimosa Circle, is commonly referred to as the "Mayor of Mimosa Circle" due to his leadership and outreach as a good neighbor;

Directs: On Sunday, December 1, Mr. Freeman noticed flames and smoke coming from his neighbor's house, and upon seeing his neighbor, the mother of two children, escape the flames, he reacted quickly and calmly in assessing the immediate need for assistance;

Mr. Freeman was told by the mother that her two children - ages 3 and 5 - were still in the house, so Mr. Freeman quickly responded by locating the children, breaking a window to reach them, and lifting them out to safety and out of harm's way;

This selfless act of rescue is no surprise to people who know Mr. Freeman, as he has long been reputed for seeking out opportunities to help others in need,

In gratitude for the courage and boldness shown by Mr. Edward Freeman in his rescue of two small children from a burning house, despite the threat of potential danger to his own life, and despite the fact that Mr. Freeman would prefer no special recognition for his brave deed, the City of Chattanooga does declare Mr. Edward Freeman this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December, 2013, to be a hero in the highest regard.
