

### In-Person & Electronic-Conducted Meeting Chattanooga, Tennessee **COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES** April 20, 2021 6:00 PM

# CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Chip Henderson called the meeting to order by electronic means. A quorum was present via electronic means that included Vice-Chairman Ken Smith and Councilpersons Carol Berz, Anthony Byrd, Demetrus Coonrod, Raquetta Dotley, Isiah Hester, Jenny Hill, and Darrin Ledford. # **ELECTION OF OFFICERS 2021-2022**

### Council Chair

Chairman Henderson opened the floor for nominations for Council Chair. **Councilwoman Berz moved** to nominate Chip Henderson for Council Chair. Councilman Ledford seconded. There were no other nominations.

**Councilman Ledford moved** to close the nominations. Councilman Byrd seconded. Upon roll call vote, Chairman Henderson was elected unanimously (9-0) for another term as Council Chair.

# Council Vice-Chair

Chairman Henderson took nominations from the floor for Vice-Chair. **Councilman Byrd moved** to nominate Ken Smith for Vice-Chair. Councilman Ledford seconded. There were no further nominations.

**Councilman Ledford moved** to close the nominations. Councilman Byrd seconded. Upon roll call vote, Vice-Chairman Smith was elected unanimously (9-0) for another term as Council Vice-Chair.
