August 10, 2021 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

A hearing ensued, with Chairman Henderson recognizing the Applicant and the Opposition. Vice-Chairman informed the Council about a mislabeling on the location of this rezoning and intended to defer to get a legal correction on the language.

Applicant:

• **Mike Price** (MAP Engineers) –There is a plan that includes an undeveloped area leading from Big Ridge Road to Hixson Pike that will be left as greenspace. He intends to leave that area undeveloped, which keeps with the Low Water Bridge Apartments south of this development. He believes this area may be the concern of the opposition.

Opposition:

Michael Allen – His only problem with the rezoning is the notice section listing the 6000 blocks of Big Ridge Road. He would have no problem with rezoning the 6800 block of Big Ridge. However, he and his neighbors at 6000 – 6799 Big Ridge Road would not want this.

Mr. Price declined the opportunity to make a rebuttal. Vice-Chairman Smith informed the Council that there was an error in the addressing for this rezoning: it should be should be the "6000 blocks of Hixson Pike," not Big Ridge Road. He also noted that the addresses that Mr. Allen was concerned about were not under consideration tonight. Therefore, **Vice-Chairman Smith moved** to defer to August 24, 2021 to have the language corrected. Councilman Byrd seconded. The motion carried unanimously (8-0) upon roll call vote. Vice-Chairman Smith also informed the Council that the Regional Planning Agency will submit an Alternate Version of this rezoning that corrects the addressing and adds a condition to keep the undeveloped R-1 section as undeveloped property in the rezoning.
