4/27/23	Wastewater	Title search, deed, and title policy for property for e2i2 project	\$69,055	Title Guaranty and Trust Co	We have engaged with Title Guaranty to address a title deficiency and to secure title insurance for the e2i2 project site at Cornelison Rd, which is in the process of being transferred from WWTA to the City. The cost of the work is high due to the title insurance for \$50M+ value of the asset being constructed on the site. We have explored using the legal services blanket agreement that Title Guaranty is currently on, but OCA has indicated this work is not eligible to proceed under that blanket agreement. This work is time-sensitive because the construction Notice to Proceed (NTP) for e2i2 cannot be issued until this is addressed (IDB is issuing the NTP and leasing the property from

	the City; we cannot enter into the lease until the City owns the property), and the clock is ticking with WIFIA (the EPA program providing 49% of this project's funding) to get the project completed. Because the cost of the work is over \$50,000 it will require Council approval if it does not
	proceed as an emergency purchase.
