CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chair Jenny Hill called the meeting to order. A quorum was present that also included Councilpersons Demetrus Coonrod, Chip Henderson, Darrin Ledford, Marvene Noel, and Ken Smith. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 38, ZONING ORDINANCE, SO AS TO REZONE PROPERTIES LOCATED AT 1111 NORTH HAWTHORNE STREET AND AN UNADDRESSED PROPERTY IN THE 1100 BLOCK OF NORTH HAWTHORNE STREET, FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL ZONE TO R-T/Z RESIDENTIAL TOWNHOUSE/ZERO LOT LINE ZONE, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

Karen Rennich, Deputy Director of Regional Planning, briefed the Council on this rezoning. She advised that the ordinance in front of the Council recommends to approve the R-T/Z zone with the

condition of single-family detached residential uses. Vice Chair Hill opened the floor to hear from the Applicant and members of the Opposition.

Applicant:

• <u>Calvin Ball</u> – He informed the Council about the two lots they had, which were subdivided to create three lots. He has talked to the Avondale Neighborhood Association president about his plans for three single family homes, all one-level, with one off street parking space per address.

Opposition:

- <u>Mallory Marsh</u> She lives on North Hawthorne Street and argued that the street is too narrow and does not have any available parking on the street. She advised that an Avondale meeting would take place this Saturday regarding this case. She also noted that there are five homeowners in proximity of these homes who all have the same concerns, some of them were unable to attend tonight.
- <u>Ken Smith</u> He is President of the Avondale Neighborhood Association, which opposes any plan for a small density, multi-family development. They spoke with Mr. Ball, who told them he will build single family homes, which they do not oppose. There is a consensus on the street that Mr. Ball should come to the neighborhood meeting Saturday to discuss the type of development he is planning with these homes. They also would like for Mr. Ball to discuss his development plans for the other properties that he owns in the neighborhood.

Councilman Ledford informed Opposition that an ordinance requires two readings; therefore, there was time to work with the Applicant on the conditions.

<u>Rebuttal</u>: Mr. Ball informed Council that he would be happy to meet with the neighbors, but discouraged the idea of adding parking spaces in the front yards of the homes.

Councilwoman Noel questioned one of the neighbors (unnamed) about not being advised of the parking concerns until this meeting. She questioned Mr. Smith about the opposition expressed at this meeting.

Councilwoman Noel moved to defer one week in reference to the parking concerns. Councilman Henderson seconded. The motion carried.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO APPLY FOR, AND IF AWARDED, ACCEPT A COMPETITIVE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN RESOURCE PROTECTION GRANT FROM THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND CONSERVATION (TDEC) TO ADDRESS IN-STREAM SEDIMENT POLLUTION RATES IN THE MOUNTAIN CREEK WATERSHED THROUGH THREE (3) STREAM RESTORATION PROJECTS, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,785,000.00, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY'S SEVENTEEN (17%) PERCENT MATCH OF \$300,000.00, FOR A TOTAL PROJECT COST OF \$2,085,000.00.
