 Valerie Epstein, Atty. – She voiced concerns on behalf of the neighbors about the R-3 designation, the fire department's determination, the increase in the number of cars, and traffic hazards. [View here]

<u>Rebuttal</u>: Mr. Fidati rebutted statements about the fire department's determination, R-3 zoning, number of cars, location of parking, parking enforcement, and traffic hazards. [View here]

Councilman Ledford advised the Chair that Opposition still had four minutes remaining to speak. Chair Dotley opened the floor to members of the Opposition who wished to use that remaining time. She recognized the following person:

Carolyn Massengale –She lives directly across the street from the properties. She
had been opposition to the rezoning until witnessing an emergency vehicle come to
their street to assist her mother. She and several of her neighbors are no longer in
