COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

February 13, 2024 3:30 PM

CALL TO ORDER

The Applicants agreed to the list of conditions.

Discussion ensued. Councilwoman Berz confirmed for Vice Chair Hill that the 12-percent would apply to 2-bedroom units. Councilman Ledford expressed thanks to the councilwoman and applicants. Councilwoman Berz asked the Applicants to stay in touch with her on the project. Ms. Moody described the following amenities for the record: lobby lounge, laundry, fitness center, high-speed wi-fi, and a bike rack.
