COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

April 30, 2024 3:30 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chair Chip Henderson called the business meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. A quorum was present that also included Councilpersons Ken Smith, Darrin Ledford, Isiah Hester, Carol Berz, Raquetta Dotley, Demetrus Coonrod, and Marvene Noel. CALL TO ORDER: Councilman Hester, Committee Chair, called the Parks & Public Works Committee to order at 3:36 p.m. with a quorum of eight councilpersons present. [View the full committee meeting here.]

MINUTES APPROVAL: On motion of Councilman Ledford and seconded by Councilwoman Dotley, the minutes of the last meeting (April 23, 2024) were approved as published.

BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE

PROCEDURAL NOTE: Councilman Hester yielded control of the meeting to Councilwoman Berz for the Budget & Finance Committee.

CALL TO ORDER: Councilwoman Berz, Committee Chair, called the Budget & Finance Committee to order at 3:41 p.m. with a quorum of eight councilpersons present. [View the full committee meeting here.]

Presentation of Proposed FY25 Budget

Councilwoman Berz thanked everyone in Mr. Ewalt's office for their hard work and preparing the presentation. She informed the Assembly that everything relative to the budget will be by public meeting and streaming. She noted that the budget education sessions for the Council and the public will start next week, May 7. She then turned the meeting over to Mr. Ewalt, who gave an overview of the FY25 Proposed Budget. Mr. Ewalt Showed slides during the presentation of how budgets were dispersed throughout the City of Chattanooga. Discussion ensued and touched upon the following topics:

- Public Safety (raises)
- Pedestrian Safety
- Infrastructure Funding
- Violence reduction
- 7.4 Million dollars in new revenue
- \$500,000 towards 85 bridges across the City of Chattanooga
- \$1 Million dollars to Affordable Housing Funding
- Adding 23 Police Officers & 9 Firemen positions
- Homelessness partnership with Coalition AIM Center
- Inflationary Forces

- End of Pandemic-Era Funding
- Maximizing the Impact of One-Time Federal dollars

Mr. Ewalt ended the presentation with the budget timeline:

- Budget education sessions on May 7, May 14, May 21, & June 4, 2024
- Public Hearing on the FY25 budgets on June 4, 2024
- Ordinance first readings on June 11, 2024
- Ordinance second readings on June 18, 2024

He also asked the Budget and Finance team to stand for recognition. Councilwoman Berz advised that the Council will dive into the budget details at the education sessions. She asked the public to join the sessions by watching online and by sending questions to the Council members who represent their districts. She then yielded the chair of the meeting back to Chair Henderson.

EXPLANATION

The oxygen plant has two compressors. During repair cycle, the backup compressor experienced maintenance issues, which required immediate servicing. Both compressors are in need of repair and have been elevated to an emergency purchase status. The not-to-exceed amount includes critical spare parts, full repair of both compressors as well as two sets of spares. Centrifugal Technologies is the most qualified company to repair the compressors. Currently, the City does not have an agreement with a qualified contractor to repair the compressors. Failure of the compressors could result in significant regulatory non-compliance penalties from TDEC and EPA as well as increase the risk of discharging partially treated effluent from the facility.
