A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO APPLY FOR, AND IF AWARDED, ACCEPT AN INFLATION REDUCTION ACT – URBAN AND COMMUNITY FORESTRY GRANT FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE – FOREST SERVICE (FS) URBAN AND COMMUNITY FORESTRY PROGRAM, FOR A FIVE-YEAR GRANT PERIOD, FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$15 MILLION.
