September 26, 2023

#### Call to Order

Councilwoman Demetrus Coonrod, Committee Chair, called the meeting to order at 3:45 p.m. in the Assembly Room of the John P. Franklin, Sr. City Council Building. #### One Westside TIF

Councilwoman Coonrod opened the floor to Mr. Freeman, who gave a brief recap of the TIF process and where the City currently is in the process. [The full presentation may be viewed <a href="here">here</a>.] Mr. Freeman then yielded the floor to the other participants in the project, who presented the following:

- The Bend (Mr. White):
  - Project highlights
  - Current pipeline
- Westside Evolves (Mr. Minhas):
  - The properties contained within the Westside and their current ownership
  - Aging infrastructure at College Hill Courts and Gateway Tower

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- The need for HUD's Choice Neighborhoods grant in order to implement necessary repairs, demolition, and construction
- o The requirements of the Choice Neighborhoods grant:
  - One-for-one replacement of housing
  - Right to return
  - Relocation & mobility counseling
- o CHA's partnership with:
  - Housing Opportunities Unlimited relocation partner company

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- Urban Strategies, Inc. case management partner for Westside
- A phasing summary for the relocation of Westside's current residents as well as the one-for-one replacement housing (Ms. Davis)
- The City's role in the Choice Neighborhoods grant (Mr. Freeman):
  - o Resolutions needed before December 8, 2023, to be considered for the grant
  - Modifications that have been made to the Economic Impact Plan, to provide more oversight for City Council
  - Investments the City could make towards affordable housing, education, and public infrastructure if the grant is awarded
- The next steps (Mr. Freeman)

- Accuracy and/or obsolescence of the surveys conducted on Westside residents
- Issues with the relocation ratios & where current residents will be placed during the interim
- Concern over the right to return & the 'good standing' requirements
- Concern over STVR zoning requests already received for the Westside by CHA affiliated firms
- What happens to the project if the grant & other federal funding is not awarded
- Length of time it will take to implement & complete each project phase
- Transitional services that will be offered to residents to encourage upwards mobility
