# PLANNING AND ZONING COMMITTEE MINUTES:

November 13, 2018

#### In Attendance

### **Approval of Minutes**

**On motion of Councilman Gilbert** and seconded by Councilman Henderson, the minutes of the last meeting (November 6, 2018) were approved as published.

# **Update on Steep Slopes and Floodplains**

Mr. Bridger gave an update on the public hearing that was held November 6<sup>th</sup>. Both he and Councilman Ledford spoke on the language for the interim regulation. Mr. Bridger also gave a presentation on the draft of the regulation that included information on the following:

- Applied thought
- Stormwater permitting
- Steep Slope
- Floodplains
- Exemptions

Mr. Noblett then spoke to the code and provisions made. Councilman Ledford opened the floor to Mr. Bennett, who read a statement representing to Homebuilders Association and why they are hesitant regarding the regulation.

A discussion ensued in which the Council questioned Mr. Bridger, Mr. Rucker and Mr. Noblett on the following topics:

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- Proposed resolution and specific language (Councilman Mitchell)
- Steep slopes area (Councilman Henderson)
- Small business and how affected (Councilman Gilbert)

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- Impact on Affordable Housing (Councilman Gilbert)
- Specificity about what has been approved (Councilwoman Berz)
- Current status/process (Councilwoman Berz)
- Solutions to temporary development requirements (Councilman Henderson)

Councilman Byrd asked those in the room that were against the regulation to please reach out to him that the Council may address concerns and come to a resolution before making their final decision. Upon no further questions or comments, the issue was closed.
