Current Program Status

The Water Quality Program includes 150 employees who meet the needs of the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) NPDES Permit, provide drainage and flood control and development services. The Water Quality Fee is assessed on annual property tax bills.

Current Rate: \$115.20 per ERU annually

Current Projected Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 Gross Revenue: \$21,033,255

Recommended Programs

To meet permitted mandates and provide the expected level of service to our citizens the following rate structure and programs are recommended for FY 2019 through FY 2023:

New and Expanded Activities (5 year average costs)

- Perform CIP projects to address TMDL's for \$2.0 Million per year
- Expand program for Green Infrastructure Maintenance for \$0.5 Million per year
- Increase Drainage Infrastructure projects by \$1.0 Million per year
- New Program for Maintenance of Residential Detention Ponds for \$1 Million per year
- Increase Land Development Fees to decrease level of subsidy from WQ fees.
- Fund WQ CIP with available funds per year: \$3.5 Million to \$10.2 Million during first 5 years
