## **COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**

February 9, 2016 6:00 PM

#### CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairwoman Carol Berz called the meeting to order with Vice Chair Moses Freeman and Council members Chris Anderson, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Yusuf Hakeem, Chip Henderson, Jerry Mitchell and Ken Smith all present. Deputy City Attorney Phil Noblett and Council Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC, were also present.

### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilman Anderson led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. He then invited Senior Pastor Timothy Careathers of Westside Baptist Church to give the invocation.

# Mayor's Council for Women – Justice Committee

Chairwoman Berz introduced Lillie Wills, Chair of the Justice Committee. Ms. Wills stated that there were 23 members of the committee. She asked those in the committee to introduce themselves and the organizations they represent: Brenda Freeman, Kay Baker, Emily O'Donnell, The Rev. Ann Weeks, Donna Killian, Evelyn Harris and Cindy Hall.

Ms. O'Donnell discussed the committee's work to "address legal barriers that prevent women from living their best lives, reaching economic self-security." She invited Ms. O'Donnell to discuss legislation drafted on behalf of the committee to amend the state's landlord/tenant law. According to the city's website, the legislation is intended to "address the eviction of a victim of domestic violence when the violence is the underlying cause of the eviction." Ms. O'Donnell discussed the purpose of the legislation and discussed the committee's white paper on housing and women. Ms. Wills and Ms. O'Donnell also responded to questions from Councilmen Hakeem, Mitchell and Freeman. In addition, Councilman Gilbert commended the work of the Council. Ms. O'Donnell agreed to send the legislations' bill number to the Council so that those wishing to help the committee could contact with legislators about the bill. Councilman Anderson offered to work with Ms. O'Donnell to draft a resolution from the Council as a show of support of their bill.

Chairwoman Berz also recognized and welcomed students from U.T. Chattanooga's School of Photojournalism and Southern Adventist University who were in attendance.

# RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Attorney Noblett read the rules of procedure for persons wishing to address the Council on non-agenda items. After which, Chairwoman Berz recognized the following persons:

- Tamra Woodard (Woodard Family Pl.) She asked the Council to instruct the CPD to release the names of the officers who shot Javario Eagle and asked the Council to fire them. She asked the Council to take the forefront on police violence.
- Torrence Collins (Kirby Ave.) He asked for justice for Javario Eagle. He stated that he
  met Mr. Eagle five years ago when Javario at St. Jude from treatments. He described an
  incident where he was held at gunpoint by the CPD.
- Madeline Dougherty (Tally Rd.) She is a member of Concerned Citizens for Justice (CCJ) and stated that she wants the CPD held accountable for the death of Javario Eagle. She asked the Council and Administration to look into the laws regarding officer shootings.
- Nathan King (Orchard View Ave.) As a member of CCJ, he voiced concerns about the
  amount of the city budget allocated to the police department's recruiting, training and
  ammunitions. He would rather see increased funding going to recreation centers and
  workforce development. He would like to know the names of the officers who killed Javario
  Eagle.
- Monty Bell (Chattanooga) He inquired about the January 15 letter that he had sent to
  the City Attorney and Chairwoman Berz regarding his driving privileges. He voiced
  concerns about conversations about African-Americans that don't involve AfricanAmericans themselves. He voiced concerns about the starting his communications
  business again.
