COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

March 14, 2017 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Moses Freeman called the meeting to order with Vice Chair Jerry Mitchell and Council members Carol Berz, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Yusuf Hakeem, Chip Henderson and Ken Smith all present. City Attorney Wade Hinton and Council Support Specialist Keren Campbell were also present. Councilman Chris Anderson was not present.

Fire Department

Captain Travis Williams gave a report on the Safety Department for Firefighters that included his roles and responsibilities, health and safety. Councilman Gilbert expressed his appreciation for a job well done on speaking on behalf of Firefighters.

- Councilman Henderson also expressed his appreciation for the job being done and then
 inquired about coverage pertaining to cancer. Councilman Smith echoed his appreciation
