## **PUBLIC HEARING - HIDDEN ACRES APARTMENTS**

A RESOLUTION REGARDING HIDDEN ACRES APARTMENTS AND PUBLIC FINANCE AUTHORITY MULTIFAMILY HOUSING REVENUE BONDS (DOGWOOD HOUSING, INC. SOUTHEAST PORTFOLIO PROJECT) SERIES 2016.

Attorney Noblett gave an introduction to the proposed resolution. He informed the Council that the city had been contacted on February 5, 2016, by an attorney representing a developer that was rehabilitating nine complexes in four states. He indicated that one of the properties to be rehabilitated was the Hidden Acres Apartments, a low-income housing unit, in Hixson. He explained that the IRS required a TEFRA (Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act) hearing before a body of elected officials so that members of the public could express their views on the project. He informed the Council that public notice was required 14 days prior to the hearing, and that such notice had been published in the local newspaper on March 12, 2016. He confirmed in open meeting that the Council Clerk had not received objections from the public regarding today's hearing.

In response to questions from Councilman Henderson, Attorney Noblett explained that no costs would be incurred by the City of Chattanooga in this matter, and that the purpose of the resolution is to affirm that a public hearing had taken place as required.

Chairwoman Berz opened the floor to attorney Thomas Francis, of Balch & Bingham LLP, who represented the developer in the rehab project. Mr. Francis further explained the purpose of the resolution, the "charitable purpose" that would be fulfilled by the project and the benefits of rehabilitating an existing property.

A discussion ensued with Mr. Francis, who responded to the following questions from the Council:

- What is the City being asked to do? (Attorney Noblett responded.)
- Is the Council being asked to approve the funds related to the project?
- Will this be a debt of the city?
- Will current residents be displaced?
- Will there be language changes made to the body of the bill if opposition is on record?
- What is the budget for the project?
- Can you explain the building rehab?
- Is there a stipulation for relocating residents?
- Who pays the fees for relocating residents?
- Who incurs the fees to meet ADA standards?
- Will ADA compliance be adhered to?
- Would changes in the language affect the bond? (Attorney Noblett responded)
- Will residents be displaced? (Both attorneys responded)
- What is the cost of rehabilitation?
- Will the cost of rehabilitation affect the rental rate?
- Will rent be at market rate?
- What are the rules in place regarding the lease rates for exiting tenants?
- With an average of \$6,000 in renovations per unit, what will be the quality of the work?
- Is the \$6,000 per unit covering just paint and carpeting?
- Why should the Council approve it?
- How significant would a delay be to the project?

Mr. Francis agreed to email the Council with answers to any questions that he was unable to answer during the hearing. He promised to send responded on tomorrow.

Councilman Anderson recommended that Mr. Francis view the video from tonight's Council meeting, which will be posted tomorrow on the city's website, to ensure that he has all the questions that were left unanswered.

Chairwoman Berz asked if there were any members of the public who wished to be heard during this public hearing. She recognized the following persons:

- **Helen Burns Sharpe (Chattanooga)** She was not in opposition to the project, but wanted to commend the Council for conducting this public hearing and recommended that the Council continue to hear such tax equity and abatement matters.
- Gary Ball (Tower Construction) He worked with a company renovating 150 units and wanted to explain to the Council how it would be possible to renovate the Hidden Acres property without relocating residents off-site. He also noted that \$6,000 \$8,000
- Edward Greene, Jr. (Chattanooga) He wanted to know if the Council's questions to Mr. Francis will delay the project. He asked the Council to do what it can today on this matter.
- **Jefferson Hodge (Chattanooga)** Since affordable housing had been mentioned in the public hearing, he wanted to speak on what affordable housing means based upon federal guidelines regarding median income.

**Councilman Hakeem moved** to defer one (1) week, seconded by Councilman Henderson. Upon roll call vote, the motion carried as follows:

# RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Attorney Noblett read the rules of procedure for persons wishing to address the Council on non-agenda items. After which, Chairwoman Berz recognized the following persons:

- **Joanne Holiday-Johnson (W. 40**<sup>th</sup> **Street)** She was arrested, but two of her personal belongings were not returned when she was released. She wanted to know how to file a lawsuit against the city, county and Silverdale Correctional Facility.
  - Chairwoman Berz informed Ms. Holiday-Johnson that she could seek pro bono assistance from the Chattanooga Bar Association.
- Edward Greene, Jr. (Chattanooga) Regarding the subpoena served on Mr. Pinkston, he wanted know what gave the City Council "judicial" powers.
  - o Chairwoman Berz informed Mr. Greene that the subpoena was not enforced and clarified that the City Council has legislative, not judicial, powers.
  - Chairwoman Berz also advised Mr. Greene to meet with either Councilman Anderson or Attorney Noblett after tonight's meeting.
- Art Williams (Bagwell Avenue) He came regarding issues that would "help make Chattanooga the role model of the world." He made comments about the city's Violence Reduction Initiative, ISIS, Islam, Israel, the Pope and the flag.
- Gary Ball (E. 14<sup>th</sup> Street/Tower Construction) He thanked Councilman Hakeem for the
  proclamation to Ms. Herrera, who lives in his neighborhood, and thanked Vice Chair
  Freeman and Councilman Hakeem for pursuing the community development on the
  Standard Coosa Thatcher site. He also distributed a document regarding the maintenance
  of vegetation in alleys, and asked the City to consider it when evaluating its use of alleys.
