COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

May 3, 2022 4:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Darrin Ledford called the meeting to order. Emergency Purchase (1)

Supplier: Hepaco, LLC Event Type: Emergency

Explanation:

On March 19, 2022, Chattanooga Fire Department personnel requested Public Works support regarding 22 illegally dumped 55-gallon drums leaking on private property at 1710 E. 17th Street. The property is abandoned and has been condemned by Neighborhood Services. Contents of the drums leaked onto adjacent properties and an adjacent alley. Preliminary sample results conducted by Chattanooga Fire Department were inconclusive regarding the identification of the contents of the barrels. Adjacent property owners, impacted by the discharge, provided an email confirmation allowing the City of Chattanooga to remediate the area. The City has contacted HEPACO, LLC as the remediation company. Mayor's Office staff arrived on scene and authorized emergency remediation. Remediation will involve removal and disposal of the drums, excavation of contaminated soil, and restoration of the property.
