CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Darrin Ledford called the meeting to order. ORDINANCE #13837

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 38, ZONING ORDINANCE, SO AS TO REZONE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 702 MANUFACTURERS ROAD, FROM M-1 MANUFACTURING ZONE TO R-RV-6 RIVER VIEW ZONE AND R-RF-6 RIVERFRONT ZONE, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

Chairman Ledford instructed the Clerk to read the Planning Version #2/Alternate Version as listed on the agenda. In addition the condition of 5 stories, Karen Rennich, Deputy Director of Regional Planning, to read the following conditions added to the ordinance:

Additionally, see below conditions:

- (1) Property owner will cooperate in good faith with the City (including granting fee title or easement rights) to allow an extension of the Riverwalk to cross the property along the shoreline of the river, at such time as the City is prepared to construct such extension;
- (2) Property owner will cooperate in good faith with the City to allow spaces for public parking, accessed off of public right-of-way Paper Mill Road (if successfully reopened by the City), in the surface parking area to be constructed by the property owner at the property during the initial development of the site; and
- (3) If the City desires to construct additional public amenities along the river at this site (e.g., picnic tables, public art, restrooms), then property owner will engage those discussions with the City in good faith, as to location, area needed, etc.; (details for any such additional public amenities must be finalized by the City not later than issuance of a building permit for the primary buildings to be constructed on the site) any conveyance of land ownership to the City to occur at such time as the City is prepared to construct such amenities.

Councilman Henderson moved to approve the Planning Version#2/Alternate Version. Councilwoman Berz seconded. The motion carried.

ORDINANCE #13838

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 38, ZONING ORDINANCE, SO AS TO REZONE PART OF A PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1115 NORTH MOORE ROAD, FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL ZONE TO R-3 RESIDENTIAL ZONE, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

Councilman Hester moved to approve with the intent to amend. Councilman Smith seconded. Councilman Hester asked Ms. Rennich to read the following condition to be added to the ordinance:

"A landscape buffer shall be installed around the perimeter where abutting R-1 Residential Zone. The buffer shall consist of a grass covered earthen berm being six feet (6') in height with a 2:1 slope with a minimum of three feet (3') in width planted with hollys six feet (6') in height planted on seven-foot (7') centers along the top of the berm. This is in addition to the required condition of a Type A landscape buffer. The berm landscape buffer shall be along the property line with the Type A landscape buffer to the interior of the site."

Discussion ensued. After which, **Councilman Hester moved** to amend by adding the condition read by Ms. Rennich. Councilwoman Berz seconded. The motion carried. **Councilman Hester moved** to approve as amended. Councilman Smith seconded. The motion carried upon roll call vote as follows:
