COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

June 7, 2022 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Darrin Ledford called the meeting to order. A quorum of eight was present that also included Vice Chair Raquetta Dotley and Councilpersons Carol Berz, Demetrus Coonrod, Chip Henderson, Isiah Hester, Jenny Hill, Marvene Noel, and Ken Smith. Explanation	Event Type Documentation
The primary thickened sludge pump at Thickener Station #1 failed and repairs cannot be performed because the pump is obsolete. Within days, the redundant pump at Station #1 also failed, resulting in all thickened sludge routing through Station #2. Thickener Station #2 is pumping far beyond design capacity and is at risk of a similar malfunction. This would prevent the treatment of wastewater and cause untreated wastewater discharges directly to the Tennessee River.	<u>Emergency</u>
