Stacy Richardson, Chief of Staff, informed the Council that there had been some misinformation in the media that she wished to clear up after the Mayor's press release this morning regarding PILOT (payment in lieu of taxes) program. She discussed the history of the 80/20 PILOT program in Chattanooga that resulted in five (5) projects completed and the changes in the real estate market causing Administration to make changes to the program. She confirmed that Administration would recommend denying any future 80/20 PILOT projects. Instead, she stated that Administration would move forward with projects that have a higher level of affordability.

Franklin McCallie. 1615 Read Ave.

At previous meetings of the City Council, I—and many others—have been hoping to find a developer who would lead the effort to use the Payment in Lieu of Taxes program, known as PILOT, for all the purposes intended. First, to fulfill a need in housing which was not possible for the developer to meet WITHOUT an extra economic incentive. Second, to offer a percentage of the total living spaces at an AFFORDABLE rate to low and moderate income residents. Third, NEVER to withhold tax dollars from our children in public schools.

It is with our gratitude and a renewed confidence in the best ideals of this city that we applaud one such developer who has stepped forward. This Chattanooga developer is John Wise. Mr. Wise has invested months of time and effort to meet those high standards.

John Wise reached out to Helen Burns Sharp, the president of ATM--Accountability for Taxpayers Money – to request a series of face-to-face meetings to write a new PILOT proposal for his project at 1920 Chestnut Street. His proposal lays out policies that EXCEED the minimum required of former PILOT programs and spell out those policies and procedures as never before.

Mr. Wise and one of his staff members, along with Ms. Sharp, Tresa McCallie, and I have met over the last three months to hammer out the details of a PILOT proposal which was submitted LAST WEEK to River City, on its way to the Housing Bond Board, and thence to you for your approval.

I now understand that Mayor Berke has today announced a "retooling" of the PILOT program. I speak for Helen Burns Sharp and other members and supporters of ATM when I applaud news of positive movement.

However, the work already completed by John Wise may well result in lower rents (\$751 per month, including water, sewer, & basic internet) than what the new retooling will call for. We submit that the proposal already presented by Mr. Wise should proceed as is, because he submitted his proposal before this new retooling was announced. Further, we suggest that his model may well be the GOLD STANDARD for the policies to be built into the Mayor's retooling effort.

We ask that you review and then approve John Wise's PILOT proposal for 1920 Chestnut Street, after it is recommended to you by the Housing Bond Board next week.
