COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

November 1, 2016 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Moses Freeman called the meeting to order. A quorum was present, including Vice Chair Jerry Mitchell and Council members Chris Anderson, Carol Berz, Russell Gilbert, Yusuf Hakeem, Chip Henderson, Larry Grohn, and Ken Smith all present. DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS:

Police Department

Chief Fred Fletcher reported the Citizen Safety Coalition event on Saturday, and thanked Chairman Freeman for attending it. He also gave information on the following:

Crime Statistics through 3rd Qtr. (End of September 2016):

- Violent Crime: Down 10.4%
- Property Crime: Down 9.6%
- Number of firearms recovered: Over 40% more over last year
- There was a 40% increase in guns stolen from cars in 12 months since State law passed July 1, 2015 allowing gun owners to carry loaded firearms in vehicles.
- New strategies: Most Violent Weeks and Surge Responses

Body-Worn Cameras:

- Finalizing vendor selection
- Contract signed by beginning of next year
- Councilman Henderson, Chair of the Public Safety Committee, will be invited to the next community and stakeholder roundtable regarding body-worn policy; a draft of the policy should be available by end of the week.

Real Time Intelligence Center:

- Field-based quality control will be tested in six weeks
- Effects in 15-20 weeks from today
- Top-performing vendors for the RFP will give demos prior to the final selection
- Soft opening planned by end of first quarter in 2017.

Cadet Community Immersion Project

Next date is November 18, 2016 at 3:00 p.m.

"No Shave November:"

- Officers allowed to grow facial hair to raise funds for cancer support and awareness.
- Over \$3,000 already raised for a locally-based cancer organization.
- Officers wearing black and pink caps during patrols.
- Ms. Myzal is the contact person for donating and receiving caps.

Partnership with Pink Heels:

- Raising funds for cancer research
- Supporting a locally-based cancer organization
- Bringing awareness through police car with a body-wrap of pink logos
- Honoring a long-time school patrol supervisor who passed away last year from breast cancer.

Donation of Video Cameras:

- By the Riverfront Business and Residents Association
- A half-dozen cameras donated
- Cameras most commonly-requested item from officers

Problem-Oriented Policing:

- He distributed "Chiefs Coins" to officers who worked on a rash of pizza delivery robberies in the Highway 58 area: Lt. Jonathan Bryant, Sgt. Tomisek, Officer McGraph and Officer Brumbaugh. Their efforts led to a problem-oriented approach to address this problem.
- He recognized citizen Jonathan Downer for alerting officers to a suspicious delivery, which lead to the apprehensions of suspects.

Chief Fletcher responded to questions about the following:

- Fencing at Service Center Councilman Henderson asked for an update on the vendor being sought.
- Public Awareness Councilman Hakeem asked if there was something that the Council could do to let people know that there is progress being made.
- District 5 Councilman Gilbert expressed thanks on behalf of his district for sending JB to his district after McPherson was promoted to Chief
- Recognizing Police Women Councilwoman Berz recognized the women who are officers and thanked them. Chief Fletcher noted a 15% participation of women in the next cadet class.
